Fall 2013 Residents Comprehensive Fracture Course

The Orthopaedic Trauma Association (OTA) will hold a Comprehensive Fracture Course for Residents October 9 - 11, 2013 in Scottsdale, Arizona. This course is an excellent opportunity for residents to learn from highly skilled orthopaedic trauma surgeons who will be traveling to Arizona to participate in the OTA's 29th Annual Meeting. The course will include a faculty of over 144 OTA members. It would be difficult to match the collective knowledge, experience, and commitment to teaching of this outstanding faculty!

The Residents Comprehensive Fracture Course will be presented in six (6) separate small group modules, with approximately twenty residents and 4 experienced faculty educators per module. The modules will have a rapid-fire series of mini-lectures, an extensive open case-based discussion, video demonstrations of techniques, and hands-on skills lab exercises. Modules will cover fundamental principles of fracture care distributed among six topics: articular, diaphyseal, foot & ankle, geriatrics, pediatrics, and polytrauma/pelvis/acetabulum.

The course offers pre-course education on-demand video materials, as well as a pre-test. These tools gauge the learning level of the course participants so we can offer the most valuable learning experience. Participants will receive links via separate emails with information on how to access the pre-test and the pre-course education videos approximately 2 - 3 weeks prior to the course.

Although this course is targeted for PGY2 – PGY4's, others who feel they will benefit will not be excluded. Attendance is limited to 120 residents, so early registration is recommended.
